Non-accessible content

The content listed below is not accessible for the following reasons relating to non-compliance with Law No. 4 of 9 January 2004:

- Criterion: 9.1.1.1 Some non-text content presented to the user does not have an equivalent textual alternative that serves the same purpose;
- Criterion: 9.1.3.1 Some information, structures and correlations have not been programmatically determined or are not available in textual form;
- Criterion: 9.1.4.4 Some texts, with the exception of subtitles and images containing text, cannot be resized up to 200 per cent without using assistive technologies and without losing content and functionality;
- Criterion: 9.2.1.1 Some functions cannot be used via a keyboard interface;
- Criterion: 9.2.2.2 In rare cases of automatically initiated animations, flashing, scrolling or auto-updating of information, lasting longer than five seconds or presented in parallel with other content, there are no mechanisms for their interruption or disappearance;
- Criterion: 9.2.4.1 A mechanism for skipping blocks of content that are repeated on several web pages is missing;

- Criterion: 9.2.4.7 On some interactive elements, the focus indicator in the keyboard user interface is not visible;
- Criterion: 9.3.2.2 No labels or instructions are provided in content requiring user input actions;
- Criterion: 9.3.3.2 In some cases, no labels or instructions are provided when the content requires input actions by the user;
- Criterion: 9.4.1.2 In some user interface components (including: elements of a form, links and scriptgenerated components...), name and role are not determined programmatically; states, properties and values, when user-defined, must be settable by program; and notifications about changes in the state of these elements must be displayed by user programmes, assistive technologies included;

Please note: Criteria 9.1.1.1, 9.1.3.1, 9.2.4.1, 9.2.4.4, 9.2.4.7, 9.4.1.2 are partially or fully resolved by the correct configuration of the 'Accessiway' assistive technology on the site.

Drafting the accessibility declaration
